Conflicts Between Districts and Cities/Counties in the California Coastal Zone over the Application of Local Zoning to School District Facility Projects - A recurrent issue involving school facility construction in districts within the California Coastal Zone is the conflict between a school district's right to exempt projects from local zoning and the authority of the city or county to enforce zoning requirements pursuant to their delegated authority under the California Coastal Act. The stakes are quite high for school districts because if a city or county is seen as having plenary authority, they can potentially impose significant changes or conditions on school projects, similar to private developments, which can drastically affect district projects.
