1	Amends EC 14002	LCFF Continuous Appropriation: shall be the following proportions of Prop 98: 2014-15: 76.17% 2015-16 and each FY thereafter: 79%. SPI shall allocate pursuant to LCFF forma. If insufficient funds, the apportionment to each LEA shall be pro-rated. This section becomes <i>inoperative</i> once all LEAs funded at or above LCFF target calculations.
2	Adds 14022	This section becomes operative commencing in first fiscal year after which all LEAs are funded at their LCFF calculations. Includes LCFF continuous appropriation and once all LEAs funded at LCFF targets, LCFF COLA shall be subject to appropriation in annual budget act.
3	Repeals 14035	County School Service Contingency Fund [repealed]
4	Amends 14041.5	Principal Apportionment Deferrals. Limits deferrals through FY 2013-14
5	Amends 14041.6	Principal Apportionment Deferrals. \$1,812,880,000 of warrants drawn in July 2014 shall be deemed GF revenues appropriated for 2012-13 year and \$1,520,213,000 of warrants drawn in August 2014 shall be deemed GF revenues appropriated for the 2013-14 fiscal year.
6	Amends 33000.5	State Board of Education (SBE) Student Board Member Selection process. <i>Includes limits to one term (no reappointment), changes timing, and eliminates the local school district governing board student members' role. SBE screens applications and selects candidates to attend an annual conference of students who narrow to 6. SBE then reviews the 6, and narrows the candidates to 3 for the Governor's approval, and SBE is no longer required to rank the finalists. Retains two-thirds of the State Senate must confirm the Governor's final candidate.</i>
