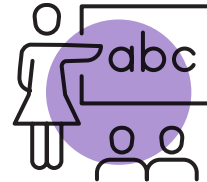

Universal Transitional Kindergarten



Over the next three years,
250,000
more children are expected to enter
transitional kindergarten.



TK expansion
requires at least
11,000
new teachers.

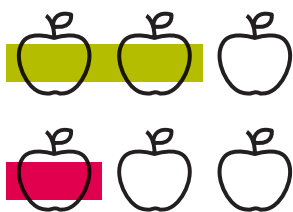
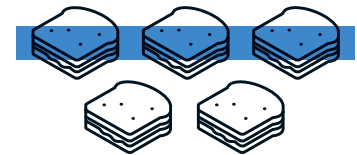


The average class size must
be **24 students or less**.



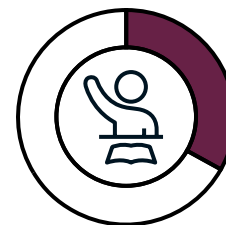
Adult-to-child
ratios will need to
be **1:12** starting
with the 2022–23
school year and
reduce to **1:10**
the following year.

Around **3 in 5** transitional
kindergarten students are eligible
for free or reduced-price meals.

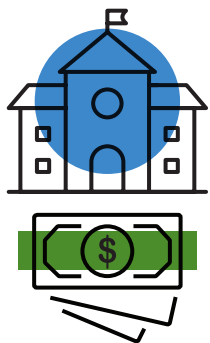


2/3 of districts that serve a
large share of disadvantaged
students currently offer full-day
TK programs, whereas

1/3 of wealthier districts offer
full-day TK programs.



1/3 of California's
districts currently
enroll **12 or fewer**
students in TK.



\$200 million is available for LEAs
for planning and implementation to expand TK.

- **\$176 million** in grants to LEAs.
- **\$24 million** in grants to county offices
of education for countywide planning and
capacity building.

education must
approve their
LEA's universal
pre-K plans by
June 30,
2022.
